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Psalm 150

The aim of the activity sheets we will be sending out is to get all the family involved by learning together, crafting and talking about the reason Easter is so special and more about Jesus who helps us in these difficult times. Start with the 'Bible Passage' box and continue in any order from there.

This is our fifth week in Psalms. You can find it in your Bible in :

Psalm 150

Read the psalm together - choose a translation or children's bible which will be easy to read as a group. (If you don't have a bible you can download one for free on your phone or use biblegateway.com)

### Discussion

#### What? Where? How? Who?

Lets use these questions to explore this Psalm. Children have a go at answering these questions – ask you parents if you need a little bit of help.

WHAT? What word is repeated lots of times in this Psalm? All the way through the Psalms we have seen the word "PRAISE". How many times the word 'praise' is in Psalm 150? (Answer: 13 Times) WHERE? (read v1-2) Where should we praise God? We should praise God in his 'sanctuary' or 'temple' we don't have those places now but we do praise God at church, but not only there in his 'mighty heavens'. God made the heavens and the earth and we should praise Him wherever we can!

HOW? (read v3-5) There are lots of instruments listed in these verses. We can praise in lots of different ways with our voices and music! How many different instruments can you think of? WHO? (read v6) Who do you think should 'Praise the Lord'? What are you going to do about this?

EVERYONE! Everything that has breath!

In week 3 (Psalm 100), you made your own musical instruments. You can use these... or have another go to make music and praise the Lord.

In week 1 we made a sheep, week 2 some lips to praise and glorify God, week 3 some instruments, week 5 a crown which belongs to Jesus. Each week the Psalms have taught us about praising God for all that He has done and even more in this Psalm... the very last one out of 150!


